

9% Decline in College Enrollment Since 2011







Decline in U.S. Birth Rates


Figure 1. Live births and general fertility rates: United States, final 1970–2016 and provisional 2017

Forecasted Growth in High School Graduates 2012-2032









Figure B.5: Average enrollment by CS majors in computing courses at doctoral-granting units from 2005 to 2015. The number in parentheses in each category indicates sample size.







Admission Factors Driving Down Applications

- More Early Decision participation
- More early assurance programs
- Desire to "lock-in" students early
- Faster admission decisions = Less incentive for applicants to apply elsewhere
- More obvious that applicants can apply to additional schools at any time, rather than submit all at once
