

#### **ANNA LOUISE JAMES:**

### FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN FEMALE PHARMACIST



Born January 19, 1886, Anna Louise James made history as one of the first African-American female pharmacists.

The daughter of a Virginia plantation slave who escaped to Connecticut, she graduated from Brooklyn College of Pharmacy in New York. She operated a drugstore in Hartford until joining her brother-in-law, Peter, at Lane Pharmacy. When Peter got called away to fight World War I, he left the pharmacy to Anna.

Anna Louise James lived in the back of her pharmacy until her death in 1977 at the age of 91.
